

FBA Sixth Grade Summer Reading

Directions: Choose *one* title from the reading list below. After reading the book, write a newspaper using the attached template. **There are graphic novel adaptations available for some titles included on the list. Parents are welcome to choose the graphic novel adaptation of any title at their discretion. **Reluctant or struggling readers are encouraged to read with a parent or listen to an audiobook.*

Your newspaper must include:

- **Summary:** write a paragraph that summarizes the story. Include events from the beginning, middle, and end. You should also include the main characters (heroes and villains), and the *theme* (or message) of the story.
- **Review:** write a paragraph giving your opinion of the book. Explain your opinion and support it with details from the story.
- **Picture with caption:** in the center box, draw a picture illustrating an important scene from the book.
- **Filler:** in each of the boxes at the bottom of the page, put a “filler” from the list below.

Advertisement: based on something that was included in the story

Wanted Poster: includes drawing & reward. Based on a dangerous character

Word Search or Crossword Puzzle: use words or events from one part of the book

Sports: May use if there were any sporting events that were part of the book

Travel News: based on the setting or a location that was mentioned

Classified Ad: “Help Wanted” or an ad for something to buy or sell

Lost and Found: based on something that was lost as part of the book

Weather: Describe the weather for a period of time that is important in the book

learns, with his new friends, that Prof. Quirrell is Lord Voldemort.

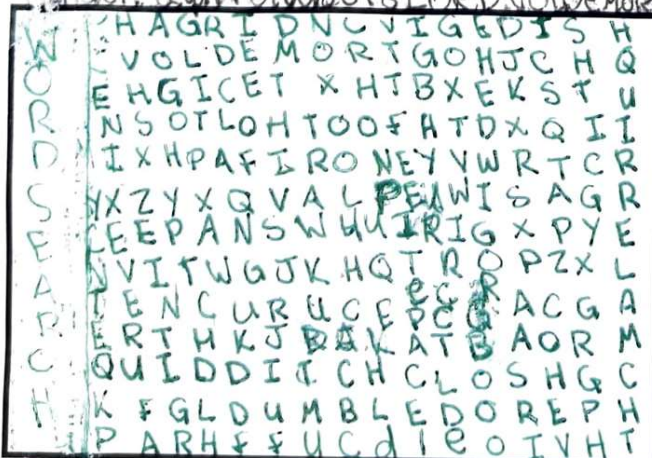




